

# FIELD TRIPS

*to the Museum of the Southern Jewish Experience*

Field trips consist of a gallery tour  
and a 1-hour enrichment program in our classroom.

Gallery tours and program options are determined by grade level.  
Educators may choose the program that best fits their curricular goals.

## Gallery Tours

3rd-5th Grade

### Strangers in a Strange Land

Students explore how immigrants to the U.S. found their way in their new home – the struggles and triumphs of building American identity and community.

6th-8th Grade

### A Vital Part of Our Community

Students learn how Jewish people have been important and contributing members of their Southern communities throughout American history.

9th-12th Grade

### Both/And

Students investigate how complex, multilayered identities are formed through the framework of Southern/Jewish.



## Programs

**Core Programs:** Extend students' experiences from the galleries to the classroom.

3rd-5th

### Strangers in a Strange Land

Students consider the objects that make us feel connected to our homes, families and friends.

6th-8th

### A Vital Part of Our Community

Team-building exercises help students identify: what makes them vital members of their communities?

9th-12th

### Both/And

Students create an "identity sculpture" to explore their own both/and identities.

**Thematic Programs:** Dive deeper into a particular historical or cultural topic.

3rd-5th

### Southern Jewish Youth and the Holocaust

Students learn the personal stories of young people whose lives were touched by the Holocaust.

6th-12th

### What We Saw: Primary Holocaust Sources

Students engage with photos, letters, and newspaper articles for a more immediate understanding of the Holocaust.

3rd-8th

### Judaism 101

Students learn about Jewish beliefs and practices, get up close to Jewish ritual objects, and make a Hebrew Ten Commandments craft.

# FIELD TRIP FAQs

## Admissions

- Student tickets are \$10 and include a tour and program
- 1 chaperone required per 10 students
- Bus drivers and chaperones are free with a ratio
- Additional adults pay a ticketed \$13 rate

## Before You Book

- MSJE operates on a first come, first served basis. Trips should be booked at least 1 month prior
- MSJE can accommodate up to 50 students Weds - Mon and 65 students Tues
- A lunch space is available. MSJE does not provide any food or drink. We cannot store cold lunches. All food must be arranged by the school

## Day of Trip

- Bus parking is available for two buses. Please communicate bus needs during booking
- Groups of more than 30 students will be split and alternate the gallery tour and program
- MSJE does not have outdoor eating or recreation areas
- The Museum Store will be open and accepts card and cash
